

Outline of an Essay

I. Introductory Paragraph

- ➤ <u>Hook:</u> something to catch the reader's attention
- ➤ <u>Background</u> information about the topic leading to the thesis
- > <u>THESIS STATEMENT:</u> the last sentence of the introductory paragraph that states the main idea for the essay and has a predictor.

II. Body Paragraph #1:

- ➤ Begins with a <u>topic sentence</u> that states the main idea of the paragraph and connects back to the thesis statement.
- > <u>Supporting sentences</u> in the paragraph explain, expand and/or give examples to support the topic sentence.

III. Body Paragraph #2:

- ➤ Begins with a <u>topic sentence</u> that states the main idea of the paragraph and connects back to the thesis statement.
- > <u>Supporting sentences</u> in the paragraph explain, expand and/or give examples to support the topic sentence.

IV. Body Paragraph #3:

- ➤ Begins with a <u>topic sentence</u> that states the main idea of the paragraph and connects back to the thesis statement.
- > <u>Supporting sentences</u> in the paragraph explain, expand and/or give examples to support the topic sentence.

V. **Concluding Paragraph:** Can do any or all the following:

- Restates the thesis statement in a new way
- Makes a final comment or opinion about the topic
- ➤ Offers a solution if the essay has presented an issue that could be solved (Used for an argumentation or opinion essay)
